

Even the most experienced quilter can learn a trick or two!!!

There are many ways to quilt a quilt and by doing this exercise, the goal will be to get you moving if you are stalled on finishing your quilt top! You will come away with refreshed enthusiasm to finish your quilts. This is for any type of machine - both long arm and domestic, so everyone will have something to gain!!!

The date is confirmed for April 6 and Ida Jenkins will be the instructor!!!!
